

ESTMEE - European Student Teachers doing Mathematics Education in the Environment

The aim of the ESTMEE project is to work in an international setting to develop mathematical outdoor tasks to create math trails for 10 to 16 year old students. At the end the math trails will be tested and evaluated in a realistic educational context.

The project offers


- refund of 90% of travel costs (up to a certain limit)

The applicant should

- speak English well enough to engage in discussions about mathematics education
- study teacher education with focus on mathematics
- preferably be at least a second year student of teacher education
- be interested in mathematics and teaching
- be interested in international and multicultural experiences
